ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: ESTHER 4:17

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

READING I: ISAIAH 5:1-7

We hear the interpretation of the story directed at the listener. The prophet now says that the people are the vineyard. Despite God's gifts and care, the people have chosen bloodshed instead of justice. What would the Lord be saying to us?

PSALM RESPONSE: PSALM 80: 9, 12, 13-14, 15-16, 19-20

"The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel."

The verses prescribed beg God to remember the time of the Exodus, the beginning of their life as God's people. But now they are in ruins. The people beg for restoration and a renewal of their bond of relationship with God.

READING II: PHILIPPIANS 4:6-9

Todays' periscope gives us even deeper reason to pause and reflect on where we place our trust. Do we let the anger of others bring us to anger? We need to cling to the Lord and the virtues of our faith. Then God's peace will guard our hearts and minds.

GOSPEL: MATTHEW 21:33-43

Jesus tells the parable about the wicked tenants. This Gospel reminds us of the importance of listening to God's word. God speaks to us in many ways—through Scripture, through our Church tradition, in our Church's teaching, and through modern-day prophets. Are we attentive and receptive to God's word to us through these messengers?

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Thinking about becoming a Catholic? Or, are you a Catholic who would like to prepare for confirmation? St. Jane de Chantal Church's RCIA program is designed with you in mind. RCIA presents the fundamental teachings of the Catholic faith and prepares people to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church at Easter. RCIA is intended both for inquirers and for those who desire to receive one or more of the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist, RCIA meets weekly from early October through May. Sessions will be held either virtually (via Zoom) or in person, depending on Covid restrictions. This year's calendar of sessions, events, readings, and holidays will be available soon. We will be using Credo-a video and print resource developed by the Dominican Friars and Thomistic Institute for use in RCIA programs. Sessions include a mix of video and live presentations as well as time for discussion and questions.

This fall, the program will provide an overview of the Catholic faith and doctrine. This is a time of inquiry and exploration. Early in the new year, the focus shifts from inquiry to preparation for the sacraments at Easter. RCIA concludes with several sessions on living out the Catholic faith.
