ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PSALM 17:6, 8

"To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me."

READING I: ISAIAH 45: 1, 4-6

The prophet reminds us that God works in mysterious ways beyond our carefully constructed safety zones. We, like the people of Israel, are challenged to see God acting in people and situations different from ourselves and to reflect on the vastness of God's will and power.

MASS INTENTIONS

It has long been a custom in the Catholic Church to have a Mass offered for someone who is deceased. Masses can also be offered for a special intention, e.g., for the recovery of one who is ill, an anniversary or birthday, or for a special prayer. The priest then makes it his intention during Mass to remember the particular request made. If you would like to have Mass offered for someone who is deceased or for a special intention, stop by the parish office during office hours (M-F 9:00 am - 5:00 pm). A card is provided to send to the family of the deceased or to the person for whom the Mass is offered. It is also customary that a stipend, or offering, is made at the time of the request. The normal offering for a Mass, per archdiocesan guidelines, is \$10.00.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Thinking about becoming a Catholic? Or. are vou a Catholic who would like to prepare for confirmation? St. Jane de Chantal Church's RCIA program is designed with you in mind. RCIA presents the fundamental teachings of the Catholic faith and prepares people to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church at Easter. RCIA is intended both for inquirers and for those who desire to receive one or more of the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. RCIA meets weekly from early October through May. Sessions will be held either virtually (via Zoom) or in person, depending on Covid restrictions. This year's calendar of sessions, events, readings, and holidays will be available soon. We will be using Credo—a video and print resource developed by the Dominican Friars and Thomistic Institute for use in RCIA programs. Sessions include a mix of video and live presentations as well as time for discussion and questions. This fall, the program will provide an overview of the Catholic faith and doctrine. This is a time of inquiry and exploration. Early in the new year, the focus shifts from inquiry to preparation for the sacraments at Easter. ARCHBISHOP GREGORY'S STATEMENT ON POPE FRANCIS' NEW ENCYCLICAL 'FRATELLI TUTTI'

(Washington Archbishop Wilton Gregory issued this statement on Pope Francis's new encyclical Fratelli Tutti on Oct. 4, 2020.)
"On the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis released his encyclical about the human family, our belonging to each other and our need for each other. The

released his encyclical about the human family, our belonging to each other and our need for each other. The title Fratelli Tutti quotes St. Francis who reminds us that we are all brothers and sisters, no matter our race, creed, country of origin or where we now reside on this good Earth. I believe that this document has come to us at precisely the right time. COVID-19 obviously has not yet ended. Many have spoken about "a new normal" when the virus will have abated. Rather I think that we should make this tragic pandemic an opportunity to think about "a new different" in terms of what we value, who we value and that we are all in this together. Pope Francis repeatedly speaks to the renewal of "common good" language and "common good" actions. The pope provokes us to pursue a shared life and to seeing "the other" as brother and sister, both as human beings and all as fellow creatures in "our common home." He invites us to build a "culture of encounter" with pride in expressing how we are Catholics and also how we are enriched by dialogue with all people of good will".
