## ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PSALM 105:3-4

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face.

## READING I: EXODUS 22:20-26

Treat all people with generosity. Today's reading is a series of laws which follow the making of the covenant. The laws of the Old Testament are meant to be particular expressions of this covenant . Therefore, when we examine them it is important to seek their intent. Sometimes the law itself is outdated, but its inner purpose remains true. What truths do we see in these laws? How can they be applied today?

> PSALM RESPONSE: PS 18:2-3, 3-4, 47, 51 "I love you, Lord, my strength."

## **READING II: 1 THESSALONIANS 1:5C-10**

Paul provides for us an example of evangelization. "You became imitators of us and of the Lord... you became a model for all the believers." How did we embrace faith? And how are we modeling the gospel to others? We have a responsibility to live what we believe that all may see the goodness of God. We are the example to others

#### GOSPEL: MATTHEW 22:34-40

Can we get to the heart of our faith? Where is our starting point? Can we love God above all else and then ourselves and each other, and then formulate practices that support love? What can that look like in our homes, hearts and society? What encourages your community to embrace real love and then give it expression?

We will ring out our joy at your saving help and exult in the name of our God.

#### **MASS INTENTIONS**

It has long been a custom in the Catholic Church to have a Mass offered for someone who is deceased. Masses can also be offered for a special intention, e.g., for the recovery of one who is ill, an anniversary or birthday, or for a special prayer. The priest then makes it his intention during Mass to remember the particular request made. If you would like to have Mass offered for someone who is deceased or for a special intention, stop by the parish office during office hours (M-F 9:00 am - 5:00 pm). A card is provided to send to the family of the deceased or to the person for whom the Mass is offered. It is also customary that a stipend, or offering, is made at the time of the request. The normal offering for a Mass, per archdiocesan guidelines, is \$10.00.

## **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)**

Interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Thinking about becoming a Catholic? Or, are you a Catholic who would like to prepare for confirmation? St. Jane de Chantal Church's RCIA program is designed with you in mind. RCIA presents the fundamental teachings of the Catholic faith and prepares people to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church at Easter. RCIA is intended both for inquirers and for those who desire to receive one or more of the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. RCIA meets weekly from early October through May. Sessions will be held either virtually (via Zoom) or in person, depending on Covid restrictions. This year's calendar of sessions, events, readings, and holidays will be available soon. We will be using Credo—a video and print resource developed by the Dominican Friars and Thomistic Institute for use in RCIA programs. Sessions include a mix of video and live presentations as well as time for discussion and questions. This fall, the program will provide an overview of the Catholic faith and doctrine. This is a time of inquiry and exploration. Early in the new year, the focus shifts from inquiry to preparation for the sacraments at Easter.
