ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 25 (24):1-3

To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

READING I: IS 63:16B-17

New Statement from Cardinal-Designate Wilton D. Gregory on the Vatican "McCarrick" Report

On November 10, the Vatican released the Report detailing the Vatican's knowledge, decision-making, and investigation related to former Cardinal Theodore Edgar McCarrick from the years of 1930 to 2017. According to Vatican officials, this report was prepared by the Secretariat of State by mandate of Pope Francis. After his complete reading of the report, Washington Cardinal-Designate Wilton Gregory released a new statement on November 16, 2020. TAX DEDUCTIBLE CONTRIBUTIONS

You make a contribution at the time of its unconditional delivery, e.g., in the Sunday collection basket. When a check is mailed, the IRS considers the U.S. Mail postmark to be the delivery date [see IRS Publication 526 and U.S. Treasury Regulation 1-170A-1(b)]. Contributions for the 2020 calendar year must have a U.S. Mail postmark dated no later than December 31, 2020. The date on the check has no consequence. For example, if we receive a check dated December 31, 2020 with a U.S. Mail postmark of January 2, 2021, the contribution will be credited to the 2021 calendar year. Contributions by credit card or bank debit through Faith Direct are deductible in the year you make the charge. Contributions by stock delivered electronically through a financial services firm are considered to be made when the stock is delivered to our broker.
