ANointing of the Sick Mass

"Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed sins, their sins will be forgiven them" (James 5:14-15). On Saturday, October 15, at 11:00 am, we will have a communal

celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The anointing of the sick consists of a Liturgy of the Word, anointing of sick persons with blessed oil, and reception of Holy Communion. Faithful who may receive the sacrament should be: children and adults about to undergo or are recovering from surgery; those experiencing or being treated for a serious physical or mental illness; those who are physically handicapped; those who suffer from a chronic illness; and those seriously impaired by old age (*Pastoral Care of the Sick*, no. 8-10). Those in good health as members of the Church are invited to come and pray for our sick brothers and sisters. If you know of anyone who is sick and would like to receive this sacrament, please invite them.
