St. Jane de Chantal Parish contracts with a vendor to provide a used clothing drop-off shed. Items accepted: all clothing, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, pillowcases, drapes, and stuffed toys. Help keep your donation clean and dry by placing items in plastic bags. Items not accepted: rags, fabric scraps, toys, and household goods; understand that these items are expensive to dispose of. The accepted items will not be cut up or shredded, and will benefit people in the U.S. and in third-world countries. After each pick-up, our parish receives a stipend; since January 2016, a total of \$1,471.68 has been distributed between the Msgr. Christopher Scholarship Fund, St. Martin's Cloak, the School Endowment Fund, and the Pastor's Projects Fund.
