MASS INTENTIONS

It has long been a custom in the Catholic Church to have a Mass offered for someone who is deceased. Masses can also be offered for a special intention, e.g., for the recovery of one who is ill, an anniversary or birthday, or for a special prayer. The priest then makes it his intention during Mass to remember the particular request made. If you would like to have Mass offered for someone who is deceased or for a special intention, stop by the parish office during office hours (M-F 9:00 am - 5:00 pm; Saturday 9:00 am - 3:00 pm). A card is provided to send to the family of the deceased or to the person for whom the Mass is offered. It is also customary that a stipend, or offering, is made at the time of the request. The normal offering for a Mass, per archdiocesan guidelines, is \$10.00.
