ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: EST 4:17

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

READING I: GN 2:18-24

As in the first creation narrative (Gen 1:27), humans are created "in the divine image". This connection is also suggested in today's second reading by the power of "the man" (Adam) to name God's creation. God appears a little slow to catch on in this reading, forming various animals as a "suitable partner" for the man but not getting it right until the appropriate partner is created and accepted as "bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh."

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 128

The psalm sings the praises of orderly family life as a divine blessing.

READING II: HEB 2:9-11

Christ is presented as the exemplar who models the divine plan for us.

Through Christ, we all achieve our identity as having "one origin."

GOSPEL: MK 10:2-16

While marriage is not the standard for all people, the marriage commitment is also used as a metaphor for the divine-human relationship.

As followers of Christ, our values and ideals are shaped by the message of Jesus, and the unfolding of that kingdom is for us, like children.

The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.

CANDIDATE SURVEY RESULTS AVAILABLE

With the 2018 general election just weeks away (November 6), the Maryland Catholic Conference has published the final results of its state-wide candidate surveys. Every major -party candidate for office in Maryland was given the opportunity to respond to five statements that reflect the Church's position on key issues. The surveys asked candidates for state office to agree or disagree with statements on abortion funding, poverty assistance, K-12 education, immigration, and physician-assisted suicide. Candidates for Congress were asked to agree or disagree with statements on conscience protections, poverty assistance, immigration, educational options, and healthcare.
