#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: IS 30:19, 30**

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

#### READING I: BAR 5:1-9

This beautiful and hopeful prophetic call to Jerusalem from Jeremiah's secretary is remarkable, given that Jerusalem was a shattered ruin at the time of the prophecy. Yet the prophet saw the ruined city as a queen royally attired by God, a mother watching for the joyful return of her children and moving to meet them in a royal procession for which the way had been carefully cleared and leveled.

## **PSALM RESPONSE: PS 126**

This week's psalm is a communal psalm of lament, visible in the second half of the psalm. The first part of the psalm, which remembers the return from exile as God's great gift, is a preparation for the petition in the second half that God act now in the same way that God acted in restoring the nation after the exile.

## **READING II: PHIL 1:4-6, 8-11**

This address to the community includes Paul's prayer that God will continue to act in the people as God has acted in the past (an echo of the hope in the psalm).

## **GOSPEL: LK 3:1-6**

Luke is careful to set John's ministry in a historical context: All of this happened in real time. The setting begins at its widest expanse, with the Roman Empire, and narrows to the area around Jerusalem. Here we meet John, son of Zechariah (and Jesus' cousin, according to Luke), who is preaching repentance as a way to prepare for the coming of the Lord God.

## **COMMUNION ANTIPHON: BAR 5:5; 4:36**

Jerusalem, arise and stand upon the heights, and behold the joy which comes to you from God.

## **TAX DEDUCTIBLE CONTRIBUTIONS**

You can deduct your contributions to St. Jane de Chantal only in the year you actually make them. You make a contribution at the time of its unconditional delivery, e.g., in the Sunday collection basket. When a check is mailed, the IRS considers the U.S. Mail postmark to be the delivery date [see IRS Publication 526 and U.S. Treasury Regulation 1-170A-1(b)]. Contributions for the 2018 calendar year must have a U.S. Mail postmark dated no later than December 31, 2018. The date on the check has no consequence. For example, if we receive a check dated December 31, 2018 with a U.S. Mail postmark of January 2, 2019, the contribution will be credited to the 2019 calendar year. Contributions by credit card or bank debit through Faith Direct are deductible in the year you make the charge. Contributions by stock delivered electronically through a financial services firm are considered to be made when the stock is delivered to our broker
