The Archdiocese of Washington Child Protection Policy requires volunteers who have not been fingerprinted, as part of an ADW criminal background report, to be fingerprinted by January 2020. To assist with this process, St. Jane de Chantal school and parish are offering one more opportunity for volunteers to complete the volunteer certification process on Saturday, November 16, from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm in Caulfield Hall. Pre-registration is required, and is a two-step process: to schedule an appointment and to pre-register with Safe Hire Solutions. Step one, to schedule an appointment on November 16, visit www.signupgenius.com/go/8050848ABAE2AA3F58-virtus. Step two, to pre-register with Safe Hire Solutions, visit https://secure.safehiresolutions.com/livescan-preregistration-application. Cost is \$55 per person; payment by check (must be payable to Safe Hire Solutions) or cash (no credit cards accepted). The session will be conducted by LiveScan Fingerprinting, which will send criminal background reports directly to the archdiocesan child protection office.
