**IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION**

If you are age 70 ½ or older, you can transfer up to \$100,000 each year directly from your traditional IRA account to St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish. This smarter way to give may satisfy a portion or all of your annual required minimum distribution (RMD) and serve as a qualified charitable distribution for your IRA, which can save you on taxes even if you do not itemize! Contact your plan custodian to complete the IRA transfer. For IRA charitable distribution checks, please make sure the check stub lists the “donor” name and the fund the distribution should benefit (e.g., offertory, donation, St. Martin’s Cloak, etc.).

**DONOR ADVISED FUNDS**

A donor advised fund is a charitable giving program managed by a nonprofit institution—like Fidelity Charitable, T.RowePrice Charitable, Schwab Charitable—and created for the purpose of managing charitable gifts on behalf of donors. The donor—you—advises the managing organization to make a grant to St. Jane de Chantal Parish. St. Jane accepts donations from Donor Advised Funds for any fund (offertory, maintenance, donation, etc.). **POPE FRANCIS**
