**ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: IS 30:19, 30** O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

**READING I: IS 11:1-10** Isaiah's dream of a messianic age focuses on a descendant of David's line who will be an ideal king, filled with the "spirit of the Lord," who will create Jerusalem as a holy mountain on which "there shall be no harm or ruin." Compare this image with the angry image John proclaims in the Gospel.

**PSALM RESPONSE: PS 72** A royal psalm that offers prayers for the royal family, echoing the hope (first reading) for a king who will be a "real" king, one who judges justly and with mercy. Christian theology applied such royal imagery to Jesus.

#### READING II: ROM 15:4-9

Paul offers a standard Christian interpretation of the Bible: It was "written for our instruction," and from it we are to develop reasons for hope, patience, and encouragement. He is especially concerned that Christians will imitate Christ and have patience with each other because that is the only way they will "think in harmony with one another."

## **GOSPEL: MT 3:1-12**

John preached an angry, judgmental message in order to encourage the reform at the heart of his proclamation. Notice the image of the one-who-is-to come, who will baptize with fire— a contrast between the peaceful messianic age (first reading) and the judgmental Day of the Lord.



## **TAX DEDUCTIBLE CONTRIBUTIONS**

You can deduct your contributions to St. Jane de Chantal only in the year you actually make them. You make a contribution at the time of its unconditional delivery, e.g., in the Sunday collection basket. When a check is mailed, the IRS considers the U.S. Mail postmark to be the delivery date [see IRS Publication 526 and U.S. Treasury Regulation 1-170A-1(b)]. Contributions for the 2019 calendar year must have a U.S. Mail postmark dated no later than December 31, 2019. The date on the check has no consequence. For example, if we receive a check dated December 31, 2019 with a U.S. Mail postmark of January 2. 2020, the contribution will be credited to the 2020 calendar year. Contributions by credit card or bank debit through Faith Direct are deductible in the year you make the charge. Contributions by stock delivered electronically through a financial services firm are considered to be made when the stock is delivered to our broker.
