Dear St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parishioners,

Since I last wrote this yearly message, a number of significant events have taken place here at St. Jane de Chantal Parish. One of the highlights from this past year would have to be the visit of Archbishop Gregory in July. We were one of the first parishes for Washington's new archbishop to visit, and he was greated by enthusiastic parishioners, members of the parish council, parish staff, and school administration. The archbishop celebrated two Masses, for which the choir and the contemporary ensemble provided wonderful music.

In the past year we also welcomed Jeff Porter as Director of Liturgy and Music, Eddie Beccles as facilities manager, Jeofrey Belen as parish financial manager, Mark Diamond as Director of Faith Formation, and Fr. Chip Luckett as the new Parochial Vicar.

And during the last year, the "Forever DeChantal" campaign's first phase was launched. The campaign will add a significant improvement to the athletic capabilities of our 2X Blue Ribbon school, enhance our church's worship space, and modernize our parish social hall. We have already received quite a number of contributions toward these projects, which are reflected in our financial report. Contributions to the campaign are dedicated solely for those projects alone, and are not subject to the archdiocesan assessment.

Soon, the campaign will be introduced to the parish as a whole, and I look forward to sharing this exciting vision for the future of our parish that will keep it Forever DeChantal.






Financial Highlights for St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish




The major income categories that provide the funds for the parish expenses are 1) offertory, 2) Christmas, Easter, collections at holydays, 3) maintenance and snow removal. The gains in our investments remain in the parish investment accounts as they fluctuate with the changes in the stock market. We have a balanced investment to include bonds. It is important to maintain the income plan needed to cover our parish expenses.

The parish expenses include the very important salaries and benefits for our employees and clergy, as well as the parish payment of the employer part of Social Security (FICA). This category is 58% of our expenses. Facilities and maintenance of our parish grounds and buildings is 15%. This category covers repairs/parts replacements, insurance, utilities, etc. The church is now 18 years old since it was renovated. Some of the other expenses include *The Catholic Standard* assessment, bank fees, copier maintenance, landscaping, Montgomery County fees, and many others.





Academic & Financial Highlights for St. Jane Frances de Chantal School



The St. Jane de Chantal School Board meets four times during the school year. Two subcommittees—budget and marketing—assist the Pastor and the Principal. The budget committee works extensively in January with the Parish Accountant and Parish Finance Council Chair in reviewing and preparing the school budget for the upcoming year. The budget committee then presents the budget to the Board, which then votes to recommend the budget to the Pastor. Some of the expenses covered by the budget include: field trips (\$81,164), computer supplies/expenses (\$48,905), school electricity (\$17,094), insurance (\$26,546), telephone (\$10,545), water (\$7,526), and many other expenses. The marketing committee seeks opportunities to promote St. Jane De Chantal School both internally to our school and parish families, and externally to the larger community. CONTINUING SAFETY PROGRAMS IN OUR SCHOOL & FOR OUR CHILDREN


- 1. County Police provided a physical security vulnerability assessment in 2017.
- 2. An in-house assessment and update is in progress.
- . A written plan is on file with ADW Office of Schools, and a copy has been provided to County Police.
- 2. The required Annual review and update is in progress.
- 1. Window frosting was installed on select exterior doors to prevent unwarranted visual access.
- 2. New web-based closed circuit security video television and recording systems were installed in 2018.
- 3. Modifications to the School primary exterior entryway, as well as interior and exterior door locks, and vehicle barriers are under review.
- Improved exterior lighting in/around school.
- 2. Bush trimming and other landscaping improvements were made to allow better line of sight in/around buildings.
- 1. The school and Home School Association sponsored multiple training events for teachers, volunteers, students, and parents for "Active-Shooter" Response.
- 2. All teachers, volunteers, and students participated in ADW required emergency drills and exercises, including Active-Shooter Response, during the school year of 2019-2020. Additional training and exercises will be conducted when school resumes this September.
- L. Home School Association raised \$5,050 for school safety and security improvements.
- 2. A 2018 Maryland grant provided \$29,000 in funding for school safety and security improvements.
- 3. Additional state grants will be pursued as future funding opportunities arise.

Parish Life: Liturgy & Music

The Chorister's Prayer, attributed to both Sir Sydney Nicholson, and to Cosmo Lang, Archbishop of Canterbury (1928-1942) is prayed by choirs all over the world, including the Choir at St. Jane. Grant that what we sing with our lips we may believe in our hearts, and what we believe in our hearts we may show forth in our lives. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

The exhortation to demonstrate through our actions that we believe the creed we profess is particularly appropriate for people who are engaged in ministry, whether it be musician or lector, altar server, Eucharistic minister, usher, or sacristan.






Religious Education

St. Jane's Religious Education serves the needs of the religious instruction of children as well as adults. We have regular weekly religious education classes for children pre-K through grade 12, RCIA, bible study, parent book groups, and parent sessions. Children are led into a deeper relationship with Jesus as they learn about their faith through the weekly religious instructions, being formed in the sacraments, scripture, morality, prayer, and Christian living. They learn under the guidance of dedicated volunteers who love to share their faith. Youth Ministry serves



Volunteers make up the vast majority of our help in religious education, and they are a valuable asset to our parish. 
In the spirit of St. Martin, who tore his military cloak in half to share with a beggar, St. Martin's Cloak provides financial and other assistance to those in need, particularly those in our parish. Financial assistance is completely confidential, and is funded through monthly Poor Box and Faith Direct collections, and other donations. The organization works with Catholic

Charities of the Archdiocese of Washington. They continue the Bread Run, in memory of their past President, Bob Flynn, which distributes bread and other food products to two seminaries, plus Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity, and So Others Might Eat (SOME). Sodality

As the oldest organization in St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish, the Sodality Guild has dedicated itself for 68 years to its twin missions of fostering devotion to the Blessed Mother and serving the parish and surrounding community through charitable and spiritual works. Sodality consists of 176 women organized into six units and a large group of Associate members, as well as an active group of 6th, 7th, and 8th grade girls of the Junior Sodality. The six units also undertake spiritual and charitable endeavors, such as providing support for the UMD Catholic Student Center, the DC Diaper Bank, the religious education program at the Shrine of the Sacred Heart, the Fisher Houses at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, and the Bethesda Cares homeless outreach program. This year, the Sodality Associates funded the purchase of red dalmatic vestments for the parish's deacons. Submitted by Helen Bollwerk.



Ladies of Charity

In 2018-2019, the ten Ladies of Charity members of St. Jane de Chantal Parish volunteered many hours of service to the parish and the community. They meet four times a year and welcome new members.

This small, dedicated group of Ladies of Charity members continued their priority mission of visiting and supporting the Catholic patients and residents of Bethesda Health and Rehabilitation Center through assisting with the celebration of Mass and the Liturgy of the Word, and through room visits. The Ladies of Charity also host the yearly Christmas Party for the residents at the rehabilitation center.

As part of the archdiocesan Ladies of Charity, they continue to support St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth, and Families, founded by the Daughters of Charity. They also participate in the yearly archdiocesan LOC May Crowning and St. Louise de Marillac Luncheon held at St. Ann's Center, as well as the annual National LOC Assembly. 

Home & School Association

One of the foundations of St. Jane de Chantal School's organizational structure is the Home and School Association (HSA). The HSA assists the school's administration with achieving its objectives, and supporting the mission of the school primarily through fundraising efforts. Under the guidance of an Executive Board, the HSA directs and coordinates parental support through activities, social functions, and fundraisers; welcomes and integrates new parents into the St. Jane de Chantal community; and provides forums for parent education. The HSA raises money through fundraisers such as the bi-annual Gala, bi-annual De Chantal Dash, Christmas Bazaar, Corn Hole Tournament, and numerous other events. The funds raised through these events

aid the HSA in providing for the teachers' education fund, teachers' gifts, improvements to the school, and to offset the cost of some social events that bond the community.

This past year, the HSA focused on security within and for the school. Please view the chart below, which summarizes the security initiatives and training for our teachers, staff, students, and parents. In the 2019-2020 school year, the HSA plans to continue with educational safety lectures for parents, and ongoing security initiatives determined by the school staff. 
CYO


CYO sponsors athletic programs for all parish children (school and parish) from kindergarten through high school. Activities include: soccer, cross-country, basketball, softball, baseball, track, and volleyball.

Sources of income include: registration fees for sports teams and clinics, and the De Chantal golf tournament.

Expenses include: registration fees for sports teams paid to the Archdiocese of Washington CYO, field and court permits for our teams, equipment and uniforms, CYO Appreciation Night, and financial aid to the players/families requiring assistance with fees. Submitted by James Hoffman.

Msgr. Christopher Fund: Provides need-based scholarships to families in our school. During the 2018-2019 school year, the fund received \$18,981 to assist 27 families (37 students).

IRA Charitable Distribution

This smarter way to give may satisfy a portion or all of your annual required minimum distribution (RMD) and serve as a qualified charitable distribution for your IRA, which can save you on taxes even if you do not itemize! Contact your plan custodian to complete the IRA transfer. For IRA charitable distribution checks, please make sure the check stub lists the "donor" name and the fund the distribution should benefit (e.g., offertory, donation, St. Martin's Cloak, etc.).
