We are so grateful to these ladies who organized the many and varied requests for items for the Giving Tree, and then collected, sorted, and delivered to several dozen charities in the metro area the hundreds of Christmas gifts donated by generous St. Jane de Chantal parishioners. Many thanks to **Denise Sintetos**, **Kathy Pascale** and **Gretchen Koch**, who with help from **Kathy Kitzinger** and others made possible a happy Christmas for so many.

In spite of the seemingly unending snow, we celebrated spring at our Fashion Show and Luncheon on March 7. It was wonderful to see all the spring colors in the clothes, the vibrant flowers in the table centerpieces, and, especially, all the smiling Sodalists. We are thrilled to have had such a large turnout for this event. **Maureen George** and **Judy Smith** led a well-organized team of women to make the day a success. We raised close to \$10,000 to help fund our programs and projects throughout the year. We are greatly indebted to Maureen and Judy and their team for their herculean efforts, and to all of the Sodality Units for their generous and enticing raffle basket donations.

Our Prefect, **Poupee Nisos**, coordinated the Sodality's Morning of Recollection, held on Saturday, March 21, after the 8:00 a.m. Mass. Our speaker was Sister Patricia Mood of the Dominican Retreat House. It was a wonderful event.

The **St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Unit**, along with **Fr. Giese**, will host the parish's annual Anniversary Mass followed by brunch in the rectory dining room on Sunday, April 26. All couples of the parish celebrating 25, 40, 50 and 60+ years of marriage this year were invited to observe their wedding anniversaries in this special way.

Also on Sunday, April 26, **Maureen Wilkerson** once again chairs our Red Cross Blood Drive from 8:00 until 2:00 in Caulfield Hall. There is a desperate need for blood donations making this an extremely important event.

Everyone is invited, and all volunteers will be greatly appreciated.

On Sunday morning, May 3, the Junior Sodalists will conduct the parish May crowning of the statue of the Blessed Mother in the Mary Garden immediately after the 10:00 a.m. Mass. It is lovely to see the young women of our parish participate in our devotion to the Blessed Mother.

To end our Sodality year, our final Mass and General Meeting will take place on Wednesday evening, May 6. Mass is at 7:00 p.m. followed by the business meeting with refreshments in Caulfield Hall. Christian Bling will join us to sell their trendy and beautiful Christian jewelry for Mother's Day and graduations. In addition, we will raffle off a gift card and hope to have Irish dancers back again to entertain us. Come join your Sodality friends to mark the end of an eventful year with an evening of prayer, food, and entertainment!

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Update: St. Gianna Unit

The St. Gianna Unit is made up of woman with young and school-aged children. Our vision is to help other mothers and their families. In the Fall, we treated two of our own unit members with a double baby shower to help with the arrival of their new babies. Then we adopted a new charity as part of our mission. We have connected with the **Crossway Community** (http://www.crossway-community.org) located in Kensington, MD. They are an intergenerational, community-centered, and asset-based program where residents live, learn, and work together. They provide both mothers and their children with high-quality housing, education, and mentoring simultaneously, in one place. At Thanksgiving and Christmas, the St. Gianna mem-

bers collected gently used and new kitchen items, such as pots and pans, placemats, table cloths, and other kitchen utensils to donate to Crossway, so the women can have well stocked kitchens to cook for their families. When our Sodality Executive Board heard about our donations, they offered to donate Sodality's 100 place setting of stoneware dishes and cutlery that had been in storage since the church renovations. Crossway is so grateful to the generosity of St. Jane De Chantal's Sodality because they are planning to start a catering business that will employ some of the woman in their program and these dishes will start them on their way.

All these kitchen donations put the St. Gianna's women into a baking mood, so we came together to host a bake sale after all of the masses Super Bowl weekend. Clearly, St Jane De Chantal community was happy for the treats, we raised \$680 for the Gabriel Project.
