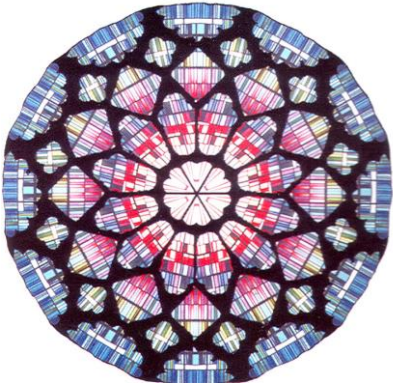


LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I IS 63;16B-17,19B; 64:2-7


